

Celebrating Our World 2009 : Evaluation

Daisi have gathered a selection of the students' responses about their experience of the Celebrating Our World Festival 2009. The students' comments clearly showed that the two project aims relevant to young people had been met, with children clearly enjoying taking part in new artistic and cultural experiences, and learning and working alongside peers from different schools.

Project aim: Young people from the learning community will be involved in activities which are outside the normal school routine and which introduces them to new areas of cultural experience.
